Dr. Richard Gaillardetz

Dr. Richard R. Gaillardetz is the Margaret and Thomas Murray and James J. Bacik Professor of Catholic Studies at the University of Toledo.

“Vatican II and Its Vision of the Church as a Communion of Communions”

He will explore the council’s vision of the church as a *communio ecclesiarum*, that is, a communion of local/particular churches and the practical consequences of the council’s ecclesiological vision.

“Ministry Within A Communion Ecclesiology”

A comprehensive theology of ministry will be developed within an ecclesiology of communion affirming the distinctive and essential role of the ordained along with the distinctive contributions of lay ministry.

“The Baptismal Priesthood and Christian Mission”

One of the great contributions of the Second Vatican Council was its recovery of the biblical notion of the priesthood of all the baptized. Gaillardetz will explore the full implications of this teaching.



Dr. Tim Muldoon

Tim Muldoon (Ph.D., Roman Catholic Systematic Theology, Duquesne University) is a Catholic theologian, writer, and spiritual director. He is the author of five books and the editor of two anthologies.

Tim also writes the weekly column “Culture at the Crossroads” on the Catholic portal at Patheos.com.

This text from the Rule of Saint Benedict, which calls for meetings of all monks in chapter, suggests a pastoral demand of the contemporary Church: namely, to ask how our existing assumptions about parishes, liturgies, and ministries reflect the priorities of older Catholics, and hinder young people from choosing to participate.

“ Wikispirituality?”

The title is a mash—up of Wikipedia, one of the most visited websites on the internet, and spirituality. Unlike older encyclopedias which were edited by a few experts, wikis are networks of people critiquing one another to produce knowledge. What does the wiki phenomenon, which has changed the way people think about knowledge, suggest to the Church about authoritative witness, about parish structures, about tradition?
