Introduction:

St. Peter's Seminary is the major seminary of the Roman Catholic Diocese of London, Ontario. Its mission is to provide "an integrated program of spiritual, human, intellectual and pastoral formation and discernment for those preparing for priestly ministry according to the heart of Christ. The Seminary also provides an integrated program for those preparing for the permanent diaconate and lay ministry, and for those seeking to enrich their faith education." It is affiliated with King's University College, a Roman Catholic affiliate of The University of Western Ontario and shares an integrated leadership role with the Chief Librarian of the Cardinal Carter Library at King's University College. The A. P. Mahoney Library provides adequate resources to support the curricula for the Master of Divinity, Master of Divinity Advanced and Master of Theological Studies programs. Its collections are part of the Shared Library Catalogue of Western Libraries of The University of Western Ontario and the affiliated university colleges. This partnership allows the library to meet accreditation standard 4.1.4 of the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada (ATS) which states: "in addition to print materials, collections shall include other media and electronic resources as appropriate to the curriculum, and ensure access to relevant remote databases." Responsibility for selection of materials

The Assistant Librarian and the faculty share the responsibility for the selection of materials. The Assistant Librarian makes the initial selection which is then sent to the appropriate faculty member for approval. Budget considerations determine how many requests will be ordered in any fiscal year.

The Assistant Librarian and the Chief Librarian keep the separate needs of each library in mind and alert each other of items that may be better suited to each library. King's particular strengths are in support of the professional programs, Social Work, and Management and Organizational Studies, and for the unique programs, Childhood and Social Institutions, Catholic Studies, World Religions, Social Justice and Peace Studies, and Thanatology. There is overlap in the two libraries with peace and social justice materials and Jewish-Christian relations.

Collection Policy for the A.P. Mahoney Library

Methods and criteria for selection

The principal tools employed for selection of materials are reviews in periodicals to which the library subscribes including *Catholic Library World*, *International Bulletin of Missionary Research*, *Missiology*, *Religious Studies Review*, *Theological Book Review and Theological Studies*. Online weekly alerts from Midwest Library Service, publisher's catalogues and websites and Choice Reviews are also consulted. Key publishers include Eerdmans, Ignatius Press, Liturgical Press, Orbis Books and Paulist Press.

Parameters for selection

Shared Library Catalogue: Generally if title is already held by another library, item will not

be ordered.

Language(s): Primarily English, some French. Library also has materials in

Latin, German and Italian.

Date of Publication: Principally current in print titles.

Geographical Coverage: Principal sources of publications will be USA, Canada, Vatican,

France, United Kingdom and Asia.

Formats Included: Books, periodicals, reference materials, select textbooks, dvd's,

videos, cd's, electronic journals and e-books. Paperback edition is preferred. Hard cover will be considered if unavailable in

paperback.

Formats excluded: Unpublished theses (except those produced by SPS MTS

candidates), popular works including recreational reading, manuscripts, most textbooks. Ephemera such as pamphlets,

brochures, clippings will not be purchased.

Price: Expensive materials such as reprints, reproductions of rare

books, limited editions will be purchased only with the approval

of the Dean of Studies and the Chief Librarian.

Subject Areas: The A. P. Mahoney Library is a specialized collection with the majority of the holdings concentrated in the B-BX range of the Library of Congress classification scheme. Other cognate disciplines are represented in the collection as they relate to the curriculum or at a basic level. Subject areas include biblical studies, historical theology, sacramental theology, moral theology, systematic theology, liturgical studies, spiritual theology, pastoral theology, homiletics and church law. The library has a collection in Judaism, particularly Christian-Jewish relations and a small collection of Islamic-Christian relations materials. In Philosophy the library collects materials as they relate to Thomistic studies and some Catholic philosophers.

Definitions of Collecting Levels

- **A. Research Level:** Provides for the collection of materials which support upper and graduate level courses, special topic courses and research.
- **B. Teaching Level:** Provides for the collection of materials which support the curriculum and course work.
- **C. Basic Information Level:** Provides for the selective collection of materials which support secondary scholarly interests and general background information.

A: Research Level

- Systematic Theology: Christology, Ecclesiology, Mariology, Doctrine of God

B: Teaching Level

C: Basic Level

- Language & Literature: PA Greek and Latin literature. PN Literature (Catholic),
- Religious art, church architecture, liturgical music
- World religions including Islam

Journals

Additional criteria to consider for adding or discontinuing a subscription to a journal are the ongoing cost of subscription, whether or not the journal is indexed and online availability on platforms in which stable and archived access is ensured.

Special Collections

Special collections will be purchased at the discretion of the Dean of Studies and the Chief Librarian.

Recommend a Purchase

Patrons of the library may recommend titles for consideration. An online form is available for suggestions or suggestions can be made at the Service Desk in the library.

Deselection

To maintain a relevant collection, within our given space constraints, periodic weeding or deselection of materials is necessary. Duplicate materials are the first priority for weeding. Physical condition is the second consideration. Worn or badly damaged materials that do not have an enduring value will be withdrawn. Worn or damaged materials that have a value for the collection but are available elsewhere in the Shared Library catalogue will also be withdrawn.

Gifts

The library gratefully accepts gifts but is not obligated to keep and or catalogue items that have been donated. Duplicates of material already in the collection will not be retained. Advice may be sought from the appropriate faculty member as to the wisdom of keeping any particular donation or part thereof. The library does not appraise gift materials and tax receipts are not given. Material not kept is disposed of in the following manner.

Seminary Archives
