- (a) Your report should be a critical reflection on the subject matter of the book, not simply a summary of the book.
- E.g. What in particular from this book will help you in your ministry?
 Was there anything in the book that you wished you had known about before an event in your family, or in your Pastoral Year.
 Make a general reflection on how you view the author's perspective from a Catholic perspective.

Reflection Paper

- What are the key insights that you gained from this course that will help you in your ministry as Crisis Counsellor?
- 5. What are your personal strengths, what is it about yourself that will be most helpful to persons in crisis?

This Reflection Paper will be 5 pages in length.

Crisis Counselling Pastoral Resources Paper

An effective Pastoral Counsellor will be well acquainted with the resource persons and agencies with the parish area.

This particular assignment is part of your preparation for your ministry in your first parish.

Recall you Pastoral Year, and the various needs of the parishioners.

Enquire of other pastors and pastoral ministers as to which resources they turn to.

Make a personal visit to agencies so that you have some first-hand knowledge of what is offered at these places.

The Canadian mental Health Association is an agency which offers many services ranging from individual counselling to family counselling, workshops and support groups. Pick up some of their brochures and find out what is available.

Some areas, for example, in the local area, Information London publishes lists of helping agencies. Some Parishes may carry the local handbook.

Hospitals have a lot of valuable information.

School Boards offer listings of services to help families.

Respite care for families and persons with particular needs would be helpful.

The list pf resources will be graded and will be used as part of your final mark for the Crisis Counselling Course.
