

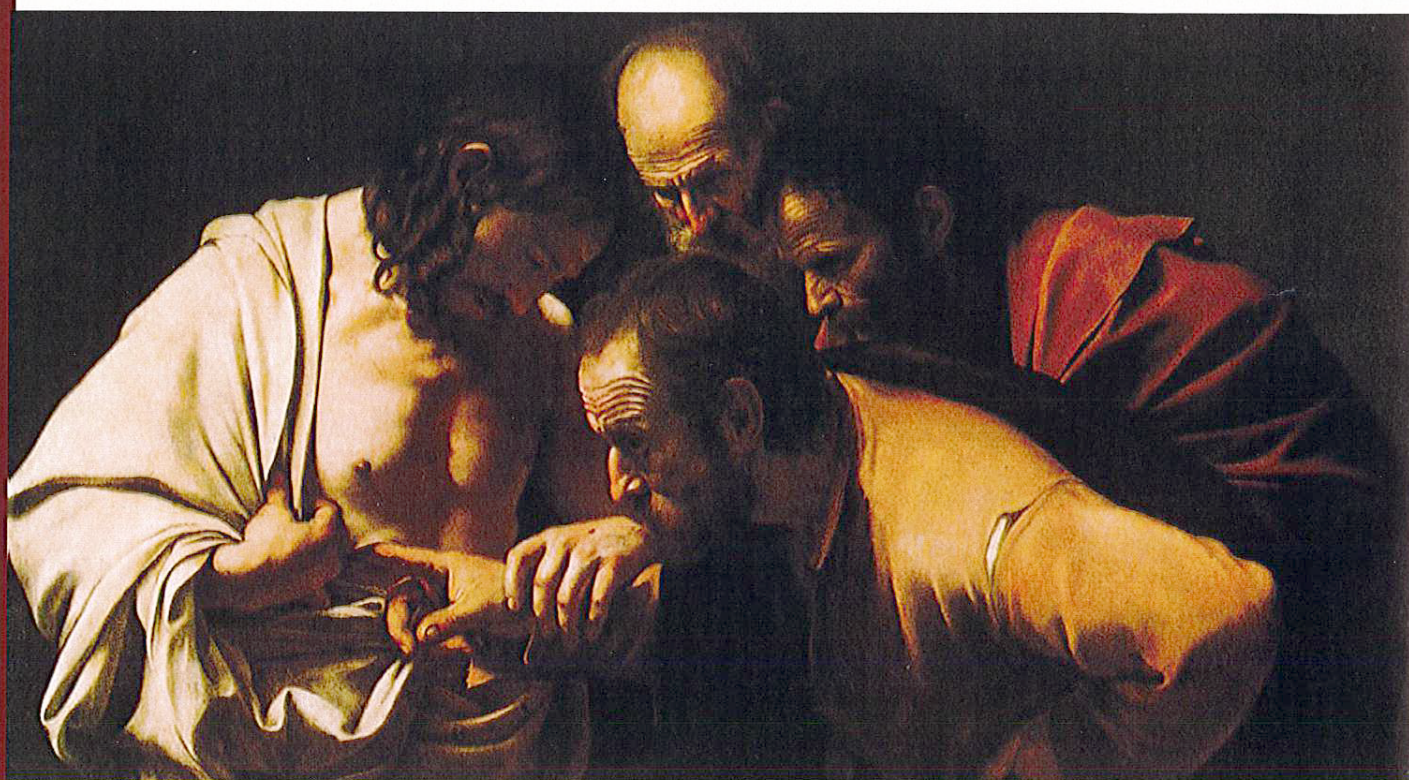

St. Thomas the Apostle, grieved and wounded by Jesus' suffering and death, is healed by his encounter with the Resurrected Jesus, who, though glorified, still retains the marks of his wounds. The responsory for Mid-afternoon Prayer of the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, in a paraphrase of 1 Peter 2.24, therefore reads "by his wounds we are healed." What is the wound of Thomas? What healing takes place? What do these things say to us – about our wounds and how the Lord heals us?
