Tuesday, July 24th, 1917

left Montreal 3 a.m.
On St. Lawrence. wrote
letters to mother &
Margaret. Beautiful
voyage so far. Arrived
at Sydney 4 p.m. Took
at 4:00 left for
Dunsmuir. Took some
snap shots of boat.

Wednesday, July 25th, 1917

12 o'clock. Fast losing
supply of land. Helped
Archie to make out
their papers. Pleasant
mess fellows.
Took snap of myself.
Left boat at
Saw the last of Canada
at 7 p.m. Sea becoming
very rough. Boat rolling
212 miles

Thursday, July 26th, 1917

Said Mass. Watched
gun practice. From
conversation with
crew & others, we are
worrying you possibly
to probable danger from
submarines. We have
no compass yet. Heard
some thrilling tales
from the shipwrecked
crews of the Armadale.
Ship darkened every night.

Friday, July 27th, 1917

Said Mass. Very foggy
Chatted with decked
crew & gave the poor
fellows all my cigarettes
& tobaccos. Some money
has been raised for us
We are about to get water
very hot. Cheerful although
we anticipate trouble.
Sea is very ugly. Lamp
night black. Foggy. Ship
stopped for some
reason some day ice but

Saturday, July 28th, 1917

Said Mass. Foggy
weather. Uneventful.
Sea heavy & ugly.
Every body talking
submarines.
1174 miles.

Sunday, July 29th, 1917

Said Mass privately.
In White said Mass
for 2nd class passengers
& preached a Sunday sermon
to 1st class said Mass for
1st class & preached in
Hawkes conducted the
music & prayers. Union
service very nice.
Still foggy & disagreeable
1499 miles

Monday, July 30th, 1917

1847 miles
mass. Weather calm
but for sq. hearing the
danger zone. Will be in it
to-night. No convoy in
sight yet. Haven't seen
a ship since we left.

Tuesday, July 31st, 1917

mass. We are in the
danger zone. We have no
convoy and are pretty sore
about it. We are ordered to
keep our life belts with
us sq. to night. Every body
on the look out & anxious.
We are taking a zig-zag
course. Sighted three whales.
at 130 miles at noon
I am lonesome. I so
lonesome. It is getting
dark & there is danger
ahead. Fired six shots

Wednesday, August 1st, 1917

Slept with clothes on. No
convoy yet. Every body look-
ing for submarines. None
sighted altho we are in
the thick of them. Saw
a huge sea monster. Spent
the most of day on deck with
field glass. 2406 miles.
Hurrah! Sighted convoys
at 5:30 pm. First glimpse
of land. Ireland for
ever. 7:28 pm. Every body
happy. Praise to God!
~~Battle of the Atlantic, Swilly.~~

Thursday, August 2nd, 1917

at 10:00 we were told to
Ireland. Inishkeel, Inish
Scotland, Rathlin, North
coast of Ireland 10:30. Malin
Head. Sighted 2 more warships
front. Convoys. Mull of Kintyre
at 11:00. Scotland 2 pm. Spent
night in life-boats. Narrow.

Friday, August 3rd, 1917

We disembarked
from the good old
Ship. Took 20th
Left Liverpool for London
at 11.30 a.m. Budget 3.06
Beautiful country. ^{W. 1000}
Put up at Regent Palace
Hotel. After supper walked
to Parliament building

Saturday, August 4th, 1917

Attended meeting at
Murray Hall. Heard
Lord George make a
famous speech. Called
for Westminster Cathedral
Saw the show at Mrs
Wong's "Chu Chin Chow"

Sunday, August 5th, 1917

Said mass at 7 a.m.
at Westminster Cathedral
Attended service at
Westminster Abbey. Saw
the King & heard the
Archbishop of Canterbury
preach. Very pious &
devotional service. Motor
to Windsor. 80 miles. paved road
Saw Windsor Castle £3-10s

Monday, August 6th, 1917

Saw St Paul's 300 yrs old. 111
500 ft long, 250 ft wide, 364 high
contains Wellington's tomb
of Nelson, Lord Roberts, Wellington's
funeral cap.
Stood on London bridge
20 min ride in underground
railway. Kensington Gardens
Hyde Park, Albert Hall.
British Museum.
Attended session at
House of Commons

Up at 5 o'clock. Sand
bags. Took train at 9 a.m.
In troop train. Boulogne
Calais 9:50 a.m. St. Omer 11:45
Hazebrook 2:30 changed.
Went for Steenvoort 3:56
Arrived at Steenvoort at 6 p.m.
Awful sensation, guns flashing
& booming & barking all round.
Reported at Officers Club. Watching
the terrible fireworks, & realizing
a hot distance from 4000 to
armamenters. Dropped 7:30. Guns
again. Guns 11:15 terrific night. This
place is bombed every night.

Monday, November 5th, 1917

Reported at R. H. L. Got
billet, & look around.

Tuesday, November 6th, 1917

Took an auto trip with
Lt. Lawlor to No 7 R. H. L. Pelt.
Crossed Belgian frontier at 11:12
a.m. Bomb dropped in Bailluel
just prior to our arrival. Poffernyys
all shot to pieces also several
other villages. New church.
Sunder Hill. Had dinner
at No 7 near 4 p.m.

Wednesday, November 7th, 1917

Hung around.

Thursday, November 8th, 1917

Enemy bombed us from 3 a.m.
to 6 a.m. about 100 bombs
dropped. D.V. us all day. Left
quite a few aircraft. Some firing
shell. Enemy trying to set fire to
our capture balloons. Jolly
received 15 letters from home.

Friday, November 9th, 1917

Moved to new billet.

Saturday, November 10th, 1917

Heavy bombardment at
Messines, Armentiers & Pashendale

Sunday, November 11th, 1917

Said mass in Stearnsack 8:30
at Neue Eglise at 10:00
Heavy shelling. Fifteen Gotha
flew over us & dropped bombs
Look refuge in trench lines
Heavy firing since night
before last.

Monday, November 12th, 1917

Shells pour down us to
Baillou road. Went to
Neue Eglise after dark &
give Communion to troops.
Men shelled on way in
Not a whole house in
Neue Eglise.

Tuesday, November 13th, 1917

Going to No 3 Coy. -
Went out to No 3 at Plugstreet
after dark. Saw H. C. to
men. Terrific gun-fire
coming back, but turned
turtle in ditch. Miraculous
escape. Walked home 3 miles
Dark as the devil.
Gun fire for past 3 days
awful. Getting on my
nerves.

Wednesday, November 14th, 1917

They say that the last
bombardment of the last
3 days at Passchendaele
was worst of the war.

Thursday, November 15th, 1917

Went to No 1 Coy and
No 2 Det. of No 2 Coy
Saw Holy Communion
to men in the evening.
Passed through. Bailleur.
Mont Noir. Succeeded some
Nerve Glass.

Friday, November 16th, 1917

Went to No 2 Coy
after dark. Very before
Heavenly the Guns.
Terrible beyond
description. Canadian
went out to topk some
ground to the Germans
are counter-attacking

Saturday, November 17th, 1917

Working down.

Sunday

Went to No 3 Coy. Ploeg street,
then aeroplane shed down
paddock. Still in same trench
fell in all directions. Went to
No 4 Coy. Went to Wypschachte.
Went to the top of the
city or town. Then a few feet
the creek about an acre.
Every yard of ground a shell hole
An Australian officer took

us beyond the range. Ploeg
boxes. Everything demolished.
We crawled along an old
trench. Because we were in
view of the trench. Camp. Camp
trench began to shell. 500 yds.
went to view. Beat of
Dumny. Back to helmet.
Pearl rumors. Wounds.
Good view of German line
through glass.

Went to Hershey for

Doctor & Paymaster. Stayed
at JCCS and to O'Brien
etc.

Friday, November 30th, 1917

Sunday, December 9th, 1917

Monday, December 10th, 1917

Tuesday, December 11th, 1917

Just because there
has been nothing
entered for the past
while. Doesn't mean
that life was nothing
doing. There was nothing
but what was entered
before. Our raid was
just fine

Wednesday, December 12th, 1917

A squadron of big
boats came over.
We brought one down
many killed with
bombs. Heavy firing
to night towards
Mexico.

Thursday, December 13th, 1917

Went to Wytschate -
Messines Ridge. While
British took June 9, 17
Six soldiers killed
digging out a dud
dropped yesterday
at Le Saul. 87 flying
inch shells. Many killed, three
others wounded.

Friday, December 14th, 1917

As a wound I was with
the officers who were
wounded yesterday
very often so with them
Dr. Linn, Major Sage &
Lieut. Brown & driver
Capt. Sankle was killed
instantly and the rest
badly wounded. Got
riddled with shrapnel
120 shells & 3 priests
killed

Saturday, December 15th, 1917

Something going
to happen. Much
aerial activity
& troop movements
& soldiers killed & 60
injured by bombs

Sunday, December 16th, 1917

Went to No 354 Co
Many Boche Goths
over head. One exploded
Shell fell on our mess

Monday, December 17th, 1917

On way to Crois de back
saw two fights in air
between our planes &
Boche. Cannonade becoming
more violent at Messines
& Ploughstreet.
Boche planes over during
night.

Tuesday, December 18th, 1917

Heavy Cannonade &
machine & rifle fire
perhaps the beginning
of German offensive.
To-night (6 pm) the
sky is humming with
planes. Weather cold
& clear. No snow yet.

Wednesday, December 19th, 1917

Moon light. Much
aeroplane activity.

Thursday, December 20th, 1917

Do

Friday, December 21st, 1917

Fine cold weather.

Saturday, December 22nd, 1917

Started for dressing station by way of R. R. track. 6 shells fell ahead so I lurched back & spent an hour with anti aircraft. Several salvos at Becker's. Saw German ab. balloons very plainly.

New to No 1 & 2 Co's
Had dinner at 7th R I
Called up 3 ccc's. Very
pleasant. Had dinner
with my host. Fine
dinner. Weather fine
cold & clear
