A. COURSE DESCRIPTION

A detailed consideration of what constitutes Roman liturgy, the various different liturgical rites of the seven sacraments recognized by the Catholic Church and some of the broader aspects of the idea of liturgy, for example, the expression of the passage of time in our celebrations.

B. GOALS

The acquisition of the basic knowledge that will help prepare to celebrate well the rich and diverse Catholic liturgy.

C. ASSIGNMENTS AND MARKING SCHEMA:

There will be 3 short written assignments required for this course. Each of these will be valued at 20% of the final mark. These papers are to be 2-4 pages, double spaced. They are to be in 12-point font.

The subject for each of these assignments will be presented at proper intervals in the progression of the course and will reflect your practical understanding of the content presented.

Assignment One (February 11, 2025):

Answer one of the following questions:

- 1. Did Jesus institute all seven sacraments? Is Scripture clear about this? Does it matter if it is not clear?
- 2. Should we make our sacramental celebration transparent or mysterious, simple or dramatic?
- 3. If the sacraments are channels of God's grace, why are we not changed by them more

powerfully?

4. Is it better to see the Church or the Holy Eucharist, as the fundamental sacrament?

Assignment Two (March 18, 2025)

Answer one of the following questions:

- 1. What does the gift of the Holy Spirit in Baptism specifically empower the new Christians to do?
- 2. What are the particular challenges posed by bringing unbaptized and baptized candidates together into a single group for catechesis and for ritual?
- 3. What might a parish do to enable baptized teenagers and young adults to live out their Christian mission?

Assignment Three (April 8, 2025)

Answer one of the following questions:

- 1. Imagine a wedding beginning with the entrance of the bride and another -the so-called Hollywood model- beginning with the entrance of the bride and her procession while the groom waits at the front of the church.
- . What differences would you notice?
- . How might it affect the beginning of the liturgy?
- . Why might you choose one over the other?
- 2. Recall a recent wedding liturgy (or funeral, ordination, baptism) you attended for which there was a special service booklet or leaflet.
- . Did it contain everything you need to fully participate in the liturgy?
- . What was included, what seemed to be missing?
- . What different contexts would affect both the content of the leaflet and the amount of texts it contains?

Final Exam:

The final EXAM will count for 40% of the final grade. It will be a 15 minutes oral comprehensive examination focusing on the general content of the course.
