Topics in Catholic Studies – Catholicism and Marginalization (CATH 8500)

in the Fall 2025 semester.

Course Description: This course will explore how Catholicism seeks to better include individuals who have often been marginalized by both the Church and society. The course will discuss how to improve Catholicism's relationship with the poor and unhoused, women, racialized and LGBTQ+communities, elderly, youth, persons with disabilities, immigrants and refugees, abuse victims, and additional members who feel without a voice in the Church. Students will explore what structures and approaches will need to be changed so as to work toward a more inclusive Church for all.
